


## SGGA E-BOARD

For those of you who have been here for a few years, you may remember a program that we used to use called E-BOARD. Initially, it was a Diocesan supported site and one year, we found that it was no longer being supported for use. We have been looking, unsuccessfully, for alternative options ever since. This summer, Dr. Briggs found the original E-BOARD program and signed us up!

For those who are new in the past few years, E-BOARD is a web-based program that allows teachers the ability to post homework to one central place for parents and students to easily be able to access. This letter is meant to introduce you to E-BOARD, what to expect, and how it works.



There is a tab for each grade level. The younger the grade level, the easier the interaction is. For example, here is a screenshot of 1<sup>st</sup> grade:



If your child is in 1A, you would just click on the 1A – Miss Lobell link and it will open that ‘post-it’ to anything that Miss Lobell has posted.

The higher up the grades you go, the more 'post-its' you will see. For example, here is a screenshot of 8<sup>th</sup> Grade:



In the upper grades, each homeroom or unit (E, F, G) will have their own color (for example, any classes occurring as 8F appear in purple), as will each cohort (X, Y, Z). As you can see here, 8<sup>th</sup> grade meets as cohorts Y/Z for Science. You will notice the color is green...because Y is blue and Z is yellow...and yellow and blue make green. (Yes, that is how much effort Dr. Briggs puts into these kinds of things! 😊)

Teachers have been instructed to ensure that their 'note' is dated for accuracy, as well as to have nightly assignments posted by 3:30 pm each day. I ask that you please give them some time to get back into the habit of posting to E-BOARD during the first few weeks. E-BOARD is an easy way to help your child stay on top of their homework assignments!
